## Scraps of Wisdom

A quick and easy way to remove the paper backing from fused web. After you have ironed the web to the back of your fabric, fold back a corner (about 1/2 inch), paper-to-paper. When you release the corner, the fabric will spring back, but the paper will stay creased. The creasing makes the paper separate from the fused web. Use the loosened paper corner to pull the paper backing from the fused quilt fabric.

# SOUND TIPS

## PHOTOGRAPHING YOUR QUILTS

You have worked hard on your beautiful quilt, it is bound, blocked, finished! While a snapshot is better than no photo at all, using proper photo techniques will provide you with images you can be proud of whether you plan to submit for publication/show, send to friend or family, or use in your home, or document for insurance/lost quilt possibilities.

#### Camera:

- A good quality camera is important, digital imaging is a great option and is now accepted at most quilt shows. You may want to use editing software to straighten the quilt, but be wary of 'enhancing' too much. Check your batteries prior to starting your photo session. Plan on at least a full shot and two details, the back, and don't forget your label! Shut off your date stamp.
- When using a flash, the closer you stand to the quilt, the more color and texture you will lose. Use lighting at the sides of the quilt to show quilting texture
- Position yourself directly in front of the quilt, center on quilt for full shot. Side shots will distort the quilt and quilting.
- Consider using a tripod to avoid shaky shots!

#### Lighting:

##### Outdoor:

- Avoid outdoor shots at noon on a sunny day. Too much light! Cloudy days provide good diffused lighting
- Avoid shadow play from trees or objects.
- Have a plan for securing the quilt from a breeze (weights), protect the quilt from dirt.

##### Indoor:

- Use blue photo flood lights placed on each side of the quilt to minimize the yellow cast of incandescent lighting.
- Turn off your flash, especially for close up and detail shots.

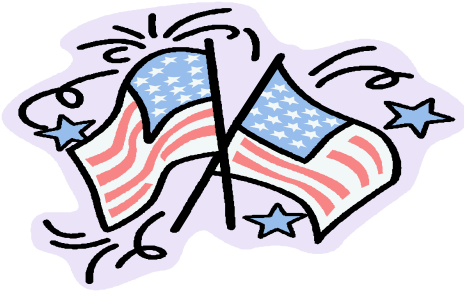
#### Hanging:

- Construct a temporary sleeve if quilt lacks a sleeve, or use curtain rings to clamp on top of quilt. Or, hang a gray flannel/felt fabric and pin the quilt straight and secure to it. Suspend a rod on poles, or use curtain rod holders. A quilt stand is helpful and can be transported to your best lighting situation.
- Make sure there are no distractions around the quilt... NO Fingers! Check for items that may reflect light.
- Use grey flannel/felt fabric behind the quilt not only eliminates distractions but is the best color to avoid detracting from your quilt design/pattern/color scheme.
- A design wall may be the perfect hanging method if size and location allow.

### Another Outreach Opportunity

Recently I was made aware of efforts by a couple of my close friends, also quilters, to provide children's lap size quilts for the organization entitled "Operation Smile".

This mission organization, headquartered in Norfolk, Virginia performs Cleft Palate surgeries, within the United States and worldwide on disadvantaged children and young adults.

The two ladies responsible for this project directly relate to this important cause. One is a nurse and a friend of an Operation Smile surgical volunteer. The other is a grandmother of a child who endured numerous facial surgeries and was moved by the organization's efforts.

The focus of this current grassroots project developed by my friends focuses on children ranging in age from 18 months to 12 years old.
