Membership chairman, **Karen Rossiter**, reported that there were 106 people present which included 4 visitors of which 2 joined our guild to make our membership total 253 members.

### Announcements:

**Nancy Lee**, who managed the Treasure Chest booth at the quilt show, said that it was very successful and she had checks for members who sold items during the show.

**Karolynne Alfera** said that she was making flax seed pillows for wounded service members returning to Madigan Army Hospital. She is seeking flax seed, buckwheat hulls or lavender and good quality flannel which should measure at least 7 x 22 inches. Call her at 253-514-4031 if you wish to donate.

**Virginia Stranberg**, Community Build-a-Block, said many thanks to all those who sewed blocks at the show. Virginia reported that 224 blocks were sewn at the show. That will make 18 quilts. The triangle shapes were a 50-50 choice over squares. Virginia is trying something different this year. She has block sets and 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  squares for corner stones so all that is needed is sashing, borders, and backing. The guild will provide the batting. Call Virginia at 360-876-1896 and leave a clear short message if more info is needed. Members who bring in completed tops at the December meeting will be entered in a drawing with a prize of \$15 off a guild function, workshop, or retreat.

**Meg Shellenberger**, 2<sup>nd</sup> V.P., asked if anyone had any lost or found items at the quilt show to see her and she also reported that there was a donated light box that could be checked out.

**Sharon Deminaniw**, Quilt Receivers, thanked all who participated, and requested they see her for a chocolate gift tonight.

**Judie Scholes**, Newsletter Editor, asked members to sign up to receive the newsletter by e-mail as it saves money on postage.

**Elizabeth Richmond**, Winter Retreat, reminded people signed up for the retreat that the dates were Nov. 30 - Dec 2 at the Seabeck Conference Center. Participants need to pay tonight if they have a balance due. See her or Charol Riedel for handouts of what is needed to bring to retreat.

**Joyce Lorenzen**, 1<sup>st</sup> V.P. reported that the December meeting will have boutique tables for members who wish to sell items (call her to sign up) and also pie for a treat. Joyce introduced our own Thelma Moyer who spoke on color and design which will be continued to its conclusion next month.

**Rondy Voorhees**, Quilt Show Co-chair, reported that the quilt show went very well and that there were 223 quilts at the show made by 78 members.

**Dixie Kliever**, Treasurer, gave her report. Approximately 1,381 people attended the show.

A motion was made by **Thelma Moyer** and seconded by **Lynne Kuch** to approve the minutes of the last meeting. The motion carried.

Quilt show chairs were applauded and have volunteered to chair the 2008 show. All committee chairs were given tokens of appreciation.

After show and tell, all the drawings completed the meeting was adjourned at 9:23 pm.

## Quilting Tips by Sandy VanDePutte

Many guild members requested a copy of the quilting tips that were demonstrated in the Featured Artist's Booth this year. While the goal was to reach out to new quilters, it seemed that many experienced quilters learned a new tip or two as well. Tips came from magazines, fellow quilters and personal experiences. It was fun sharing and teaching by demonstration. If you need clarification, please feel free to call.

1	Flannel-backed plastic tablecloths make great design walls. They are light enough to hang with masking tape, and they're portable!
2	Plastic pillboxes make great bobbin storage containers! Wrap bobbins with a small rubber band, hair band, or scraps of Glad Press 'n Seal to avoid unraveling.
3	Color the end of your monofilament thread with a felt-tip marker to help with threading the needle.
4	To keep from chasing a spool of thread when it falls, put your thread in a small zip-top bag—leave the end hang out, or thread it through the plastic.
5	To keep thread from unraveling, use a salt shaker--pull the thread through a hole. If the shaker is large enough, you could have more than one spool inside!
6	Rub a nylon all-purpose scourer over your rotary mat to remove threads.
7	Toddler snack cups make great containers for multiple spools of thread— draw the thread ends out of the opening for tangle-free stitching.
8	Cut leftover Press n' Seal scraps and wrap them around spools (or bobbins) to keep thread from unraveling.
9	To keep your cutting boards flat, hang your mats in the closet using skirt hangers with clips!
10	Wash fruit and vegetable trays and use them to store specific items or projects. Clear containers with lids can be stacked and provide the opportunity to see the contents!
11	Recycle clean cosmetic bags for quilting and sewing supplies—I like to use clear ones so I can see what's inside!
12	Trace quilting patterns onto Press 'n Seal, pin to quilt sandwich and hand or machine stitch. Gently tear away Press 'n Seal. Water-soluble stabilizer probably works better on flannel or if your design is intricate.
13	When using fusible web, place a paper bag under the item being pressed to protect the ironing board cover.
14	For a small ironing board, wrap an empty fabric bolt with a thick terry cloth towel.
15	For a small portable ironing board, cover an empty fabric bolt with a batting a fabric.
16	Cut quilting templates from contact paper—they can be used 3-4 times before the stickiness wears off!
17	Recycle clear plastic zippered bags (i.e., curtain, sheet, and blanket) for use as "project" bags. Large bags can hold all the fabric you might need to complete your project.
18	Make your own "value finders" using a doubled sheet of red or green cellophane. Extend the life of the cellophane by placing it in a photo sheet protector.
19	Empty breath mint containers make wonderful little emergency sewing kits for the purse—fill with safety pins, several buttons, a needle, wraps of thread and small scissors or broken seam ripper for cutting.
20	Tiny containers with lids like those in gum or candy machines make wonderful containers for pins of all sizes.

21	Punch a hole in a jar cap and use it to store needles and pins that become broken, dull or bent. If the jar is large enough, you can use it to keep discarded rotary blades as well. Keep one near all sewing and cutting areas in your home for safe disposal!
22	To keep thread from knotting and tangling when hand stitching, Mary Lou Weidman treats her thread by running the threaded needle through a folded fabric softener sheet placed inside a small zip-top bag.
23	Punch a hole in a plastic pill bottle cap and use it to store a spool of thread for traveling. Glue a small magnet on the lid if you want a place to hold your needle.
24	Punch a hole in an plastic pill bottle cap and use it to store needles and pins that become broken, dull or bent. Keep one in all your sewing kits for disposal safety!
25	Cut a piece of non-slip rubber padding for under your sewing machine to prevent it from moving away from you as you sew. This works well under your sewing machine foot pedal too!
26	Because new pins can sometimes leave an mark in fabric, clean and sharpen them by using an emery bag (i.e., "strawberry"). Insert a pin, squeeze the emery bag TIGHT! Rotate the pin to sharpen and clean it (compression of the emery is vital).
27	Empty dental floss containers make great thread cutters when on an airplane. Be sure to thread needles ahead and leave them on the spool because the thread will be blunt with this cutting method and difficult to thread into a needle.
28	Fabric softener sheets can be used to clean the sticky residue from the bottom of irons.
29	Make durable templates by recycling old plastic placemats. You may want to use see-through mats for some projects.
30	Recycle plastic coffee creamer containers (cleaned, of course!) to pour water into your steam iron.
31	To remind you which way to press seams, purchase a box of flat-head pins with at least four different colors. Mark each colored pin with arrows to show "up, down, left" and "right" directions, i.e., all the yellow pins would have an "up" arrow.
32	Recycle an old compact by removing the mirror. Glue a magnet on one half of the compact. It will provide a convenient place to collect pins and needles in your portable sewing kit. It also serves well as a thread catcher.
33	Recycle breath mint containers. Glue a magnet inside to provide a convenient place to collect pins and needles in your portable sewing kit. It also serves well as a thread catcher when traveling.
34	Use an inexpensive wooden skewer as a stiletto.
35	Cut and use a balloon as a finger coddle to reduce hand (and finger) fatigue when pulling a needle through fabric.
