I need a volunteer to take over charity quilts. Dora asked me to find someone as she will be receiving chemo for some time. If you are interested, please let me know.

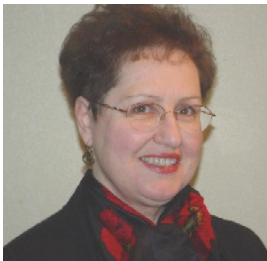

Givens Community Center
April 2, 2008

The meeting was called to order by President, **Katie Knoelke** at 7:00 pm. Katie reminded everyone to turn off their cell phones and conversation as other members have difficulty hearing the speakers. She also requested people making reports and announcements fill out the yellow forms provided by the secretary. Katie asked that members fill out the questionnaire at the sign in table as to how they wish to receive their newsletter. She also thanked the April hostesses and reminded members to help clean up after the meeting.

Membership chairman, **Karen Rossiter**, reported that there were 79 members and 8 guests present.

Dues Proposal: **Lillian Schauer** read a proposal to add a fee of \$10 to the dues of members who wished to receive their newsletter by mail. After a discussion, a motion was made by **Stephanie Raupach** and seconded by **Delaine Gately** to vote on the matter. A vote was taken and the \$10 added fee passed.

Loom Salvage Rugs

The following instructions were provided by Rita Jackson. For those of you on the Bus Trip to Portland and picked up bags of Loom Salvages may not have received the instructions to crochet a rug. This was obviously written by someone who does not crochet with patterns, because none of the normal terms were used. For those who crochet, this may help some, but you may want to do it your way. I think when the pattern says <crochet>, they must mean <single crochet>. To increase around the corners, they probably mean do 2 sc in each st (or maybe every other st). You will be able to figure it out as you do it. Hope this is helpful to you.

Instructions:

Take salvage out of bag, remove extra strings and roll into balls.

Make a chain about 18"-36" long for an oval rug. For a round rug make a short chain approx. 8" long.

Start crocheting into chain by putting both loops together and pulling strand of yarn through. Continue around entire chain.

When you get about 3 to 4 rows done, you need to increase around the corners.

To increase-Instead of crocheting the next stitch, pull strand of yarn through one loop then put both loops together and pull strand of yarn through. Continue increasing on each loop around the corner, then crochet as before until the next corner. When done tie off and you're done.

For a round rug you need to increase more often so it will lay flat.

Meg Shellenberger made a motion to go over the minutes of the last meeting to make sure they were accurate. Dixie Kliever seconded the motion and it carried. The examination of the minutes will be done by the president and the 1st V.P.

Other purchases are a new coffee pot for the kitchen and two commercial deep fryers for funnel cakes and chicken.

President, Katie, talked about changing the rules to say that the raffle quilt committee must make up their own pattern and not use anyone else's. Another rule to be put in place is delivery of the newsletter. She wants members who have horses and experience to deliver them on horseback in order to save postage and gas. The third addition is how members who present programs at the general meeting will be compensated. After some discussion it was decided they would be given the chance to run for president or quilt show chairman. The budget will be in the next newsletter. MAY 7, 2008 Meeting

For those of you who were at our first Bingo game in April 2007, I'm sure you can hardly wait to do it again! We had some great quilts come from those blocks! For those of you who were not in attendance, now's your big chance to join in the fun!

I have made a few changes from the original instructions, so please be sure to read them carefully.

The bingo instructions are printed in Fons and Porter's LOVE OF QUILTING, SEPTEMBER/OCTOBER 2006 issue. For those who have the issue, they can just refer to the magazine for colored pictures.

Unfinished block size is 10 1/2"

Fabric categories:

Batik, floral, geometric, hearts, leaf, dots, holiday, novelty, checks, stars, stripes, or 1930's

(ALL SQUARES ARE 2 1/2" BEFORE SEWN TOGETHER)

5 (2 1/2") squares assorted yellow and orange prints

5 (2 1/2") squares assorted red prints

5 (2 1/2") squares assorted blue prints

5 (2 1/2") squares assorted green prints

4 (2 1/2") squares assorted pink and purple prints

1(2 1/2") square black print (center of bingo square)

Sew the above color groups together with a 1/4" seam allowance. i.e., the 5 orange and yellow in one row, the 5 reds in one row, etc.) Sew 2 of the pink and purple together, put the black square in the middle and add the other 2 pink and purple.

To complete the block, sew in the following order,

From left to right,

Green row

Blue row

Purple/pink (with black in center) row

Red row

Yellow/orange row (this should end up on the far right side)

We will need to bring our button jars for the playing pieces. That won't be necessary until the April meeting.

Get together with your friends and mini-groups to make up a bunch of these. They are so colorful and fun to do! Judie Scholes and I will go shopping for the prizes As we did last year, those who want to put their extra blocks in the pot and have a drawing (s) so that some lucky person(s) could end up with blocks for a very colorful quilt top are encouraged to do so!

As last year, there are some of us who don't get these blocks made and don't think they should come to the meeting! Well, I know from experience that a few of us make extras and are willing to share. Don't let not having a block made stop you from coming to the meeting! It's fun whether you play or not! Feel free to phone me if you have any questions. Home 360-373-6968, cell 360-649-6967.
