THE TIPSTER aka SOUND TIPS

When our thoughts turn to quilt show and judging, the idea of professional judges often comes up. The number one thing that I learned in Paducah is that you can pay good money for professionals but that will not eliminate the judging controversy. Almost everyone that went by 'Tuscan Sunrise' voiced their opinion on the Judges choice and did not agree. We heard that a lot throughout the show. In our case I agreed with them and would have had it not been my quilt. The three judges are very highly respected and qualified so I have to think that they saw something that we could not from 8-10' away.

So if the professionals don't please everyone, then maybe we can cut our volunteers some slack and remember that it is a quilt *show* and not a quilt *contest*. A quilt does not have to be award winning to be shown. So finish those quilts and get them registered, soon. Remember that those of us who have made lots of quilts were beginners at one time and the quilts we entered then would not be the quality that we enter now. There is room for all levels. You will gain confidence and knowledge each year. It is fun to see our progress so the tip of the month is - *don't be afraid to put your quilt in the show!*

Remember if you are not comfortable having your quilt judged, there is a "Not for Judging Category". That can also be used by those who feel they have won their share of ribbons and want to step aside to give others more of a chance.

So the tips for this month are:

1. Sleeves on your quilts
2. Read the registration form carefully, if you don't understand anything at all, just ask.
3. Fill out a form for your Challenge also.
4. Get them to the drop off person
5. Sign up to help and make new friends
6. Save some money for the vendors
7. Enjoy the show
8. *Be nice to the judges....*

AMERICAN HERO QUILT PROJECT MINI-GROUP

To learn more about the American Hero Quilt Project please check out the website www.americanheroquilts.com. This is an ongoing project of 100 quilts a month taken to Madigan Hospital in Tacoma for the injured servicemembers returning from Iraq and Afghanistan. The welfare of the servicemembers is top priority so when the organization was established the guidelines were set with the input and concerns from the staff at Madigan who attend to the injured.

PROJECT LINUS

Founded in 1995 by Karen Loucks of Denver, Colorado, Project Linus is a national, 100% volunteer, non-profit organization providing security blankets to seriously ill and traumatized children. It's a perfect example of the saying: "*One person really can make a difference*". The following is the Project Linus Mission statement: First, it is our mission to provide love, a sense of security, warmth and comfort to children who are seriously ill, traumatized, or otherwise in need through the gifts of new, handmade blankets and afghans, lovingly created by volunteer "blanketeers." Second, it is our mission to provide a rewarding and fun service opportunity for interested individuals and groups in local communities, for the benefit of children.

Project Linus has 405 chapters throughout the United States which have donated 3,005,973 blankets to children in crisis since 1995. Our Kitsap County Chapter has been active since 2002. We have given out over 4,400 blankets to children in our community. A few of the places they have been distributed are: Harrison Hospital, DSHS/Foster intake, Port Orchard Police, Kitsap County Sheriff, YWCA and American Red Cross. The chapter was asked to supply quilts to Camp Erin one year. (This is part of the Moyer foundation for cancer kids).

Nancy Spalinger will have opportunity tickets available for the large quilt shown at the July meeting for a donation of \$1.00 at the September meeting. All proceeds benefit our local Project Linus chapter to purchase needed supplies to continue to make these blankets.

West Sound Quilters Block of the Month

From July 2009 - May 2010 we will have a Coordinated, Themed, Block of the Month. Our theme this year is Pieced Flowers. We will be making 12" finished blocks. These blocks come from The Quilter's Cache/Marcia Hohn. We can use these patterns for Quilt of the Month in quilt guilds. Please respect her copyrights. These patterns are intended for personal use only. Her terms and conditions are on her website. Each of the patterns we will use are on her website with more information and color pictures. Please visit her website, <http://www.quilterscache.com> and click on free patterns for more and better information. Make one or more blocks as specified to contribute to a WSQ drawing and make one block in your own color choice for a future quilt of your own of all 12 blocks.

Our first block for July 2009 was "Bird of Paradise". Make your block using 2 batiks and black for background. Kona cotton has a good black, but you can use what you have.

Our second block for August 2009 is a modified "Fancy Flowers". The modification is that we do not want you to include the center 2" (2-1/2" cut) cross in the middle. This will make the block 12-1/2" unfinished. Make your block using a green floral for the center, 4 flower colors that go nicely with each other and your chosen green, and a white on white for the background.

September 2009 Challenge News

Registrations for our Build-a-Log Cabin Challenge closed on August 5. It's exciting to think that there could be more than 40 log cabin quilts hanging in this year's show! (40 would be 56% of those registered!) As discussed at our last guild meeting, judging will take place at this year's show, and we'll be trying something new relative to turning in your Challenge quilts. Please read the following for more information. Our show is fast approaching...

September 18, 2009, is our quilt show registration deadline! When filling in the guild registration form for your Challenge quilt,

In the "Name" space on the form, write the number given when you signed up for the Challenge (i.e., "51").

In the "Comments" section of the form, do not provide any information that might give clues as to who you are.

All Challenge entries will be hung, so you do not need to give it a priority number.

Under the "Category" column, check "Challenge".

In the "Quilting" category box, check all those that apply. Remember, only the "Best of Show—Log Cabin Quilt Challenge" award requires that all quilting be done by the person submitting the entry.

October 7, 2009: At this guild meeting you'll receive paperwork, a quilt "turn-in deadline", and information necessary for turning your quilts into a "Quilt Receiver/Drop-off".

The turn-in deadline will also apply to your Challenge quilt! (Yippeel!)

Follow instructions for placement of paperwork on the back of your quilts, including your Challenge quilt.

Before you meet with your Quilt Receiver/Drop-off, it is important that you...

Place your Challenge quilt inside a non-see-through black plastic garbage bag. Do not seal your bag now! If you need one, we'll have plastic bags at the October meeting.

After much discussion, we've decided that your help is needed to make the "hanging process" easier. Please place a large piece of masking tape (or label) on the *outside* of your black bag, and on it write the WSQ Show Registration Number you received for your Challenge quilt. It should read something like, "CH-123-L". This would identify it as quilt #123 in the "large" Challenge category.

When you meet with your Quilt Receiver/Drop-off, they will provide you with a colored decal.

Follow instructions as to where to place the decal on the paperwork attached to the back of your Challenge quilt.

Once the colored decal is placed, seal your bag shut with tape.

On the day of show takedown, Challenge quilts will be placed in see-through bags, and returned to your Quilt Receiver/Drop-off (as identified by the decal color). Please make arrangements with them for picking up your quilts.

If your Challenge quilt wins an award during the show, please bring it to our November 4 guild meeting. Prizes will be distributed at that time. We sincerely hope you have had a joyful experience with the Challenge this year!
