September 2009 Challenge News

It's exciting to think that there could be as many as 40 log cabin quilts hanging in this year's show! As discussed earlier, we'll be trying something new relative to turning in your Challenge quilts, so please read the following information carefully.

October 7, 2009: At this guild meeting you'll receive paperwork, and information necessary for turning your quilts into a "Quilt Receiver/Drop-off".

Note that the turn-in deadline also applies to your Challenge quilt!

Follow instructions for placement of paperwork on the back of all your quilts.

Before you meet with your Quilt Receiver/Drop-off...

Place your Challenge quilt inside a non-see-through black plastic garbage bag, but don't seal it! Bags and labels will be available for you at the October meeting.

Place a large piece of masking tape (or label given to you) on the *outside* of your black bag, and write the WSQ Show Registration Number you received for your Challenge quilt on it. (It should read something like, "CH-123-L".)

When you meet with your Quilt Receiver/Drop-off, they will provide you with a colored decal and instructions as to where to place the decal on your paperwork.

Once the colored decal is placed, seal your bag shut with tape.

On the day of show takedown, Challenge quilts will be placed in see-through bags, and returned to your Quilt Receiver/Drop-off (as identified by the decal color). Please make arrangements with them for picking up your quilts.

Judging Information: As discussed previously, judging will take place at this year's show. You may sign for your ballot in the lobby, where the ballot box will also be located. For your convenience, more information relative to awards is provided below.

WSQ members will receive one ballot to vote for Challenge awards. Voting must be complete by 12:00 PM on the last day of the show.

Each quilt may win only one Build a Log Cabin Challenge Award, with the exception of the Best of Show—Log Cabin Quilt.

2-09Rev: To be eligible for the "Best of Show—Log Cabin Quilt" Challenge Award, all quilting must have been done by the person making the quilt top.

2-09Rev: All Log Cabin Challenge quilt entries will be eligible to receive the "Daily Viewer's Choice" and "Best of Show", as determined by vote of show attendees.

Ribbons (Challenge awards) will be awarded by 2:00 PM on the last day of the Show.

If your quilt wins a Challenge award during the show, please bring it to our November 4 guild meeting. Prizes will be distributed at that time.

We sincerely hope you have had a joyful experience with the Challenge this year! If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to call either...

THE TIPSTER aka SOUND TIPS

All thoughts are on quilt shows this month with Innovations in Tacoma, Houston, fairs, our show and many others. I hope you will be able to visit some of the events and get inspired enough to last through the snowed-in days that are coming.

Whether it is our show or one you are sending your quilt to, it will be folded and stacked for quite some time. This creates problems with hanging because the creases have been pressed in. If you will make your first fold, (that will be the most severe)) *across* the quilt instead of up and down, the weight of the quilt will help to pull the crease out as it hangs. You can pad this fold as well. If shipping, it is good to pad several of the first folds. Batting scraps work well and those air bags used for shipping are great temporarily. Quilts for the Houston Show in October had to be in Houston by August 5th. I hate to think of the creases that will cause.

Speaking of creases, be sure to fold your quilts in different places each time they are refolded. It is so easy to fold the same way but permanent lines will be the result. Also, remember that quilts need to be aired occasionally. Display quilts should have a limit on the amount of time they hang a certain way. If the folded quilt is exposed to any light, fading can occur on the folds. Remember that a plastic bag is the worst way to store a quilt. They should be stored in cotton. Plastic, paper, wood etc, have acid that can destroy fabric. Laying quilts out on beds when you are gone is a good way to air and allow them to relax.

I still think that the best quilts are loved and used so that takes care of all of the above! Use and enjoy. If it wears out, we can make a new one! See you at the show...

Hostess Duties

West Sound Quilters Block of the Month



From July 2009 - May 2010 we will have a Coordinated, Themed, Block of the Month. Our theme this year is Pieced Flowers. We will be making 12" finished blocks from The Quilter's Cache/Marcia Hohn.

September Block: Nosegay (follow the colors suggested on the website for the block you bring back to the guild meeting)

August Block: Fancy Flowers (Modified—do not include the center 2" cross in the middle)

July Block: Bird of Paradise (use 2 batiks and black for background)

The Treasure Chest is back!



This year we will feature your quilting, hand work, or sewing related items that you have to sell. These items may be crafted by you or previously purchased and you no longer "want or need". These may be books, patterns, pin cushions, small quilts, cards, scissors, rulers, unfinished projects, etc. Assorted items can be packaged together for a single price.

We do not have room to properly display LARGE bulky items. Large quilts that you want to sell can be registered for the show by Sept 18. Remember to check the box if it is for sale. Those transactions will not be a part of the Treasure Chest.

You will be required to check in your items with either Joyce or myself on Thursday night (after the quilts are all hung for the show. I am working on the Quilt Lay Out so I will not be available till that is done.)

Payment for the booth is \$150 which will be shared by the participants who sold items. The amount each will owe will be based on each individuals sales. If you do not sell anything you owe nothing. The person selling the most pays the most. The formula was designed by Nancy Lee when she ran the Treasure Chest in the past. If 50% of the sales were to Miss X, then Miss X pays \$75. (This method was agreed upon by the Treasure Chest participants that I have contacted.)

Participants duty:

1. Each participant needs to label the boxes or laundry baskets that they bring in their stuff.(We can hide boxes under the tables or behind the blue sheets.)
2. Remember that you are representing the West Sound Quilt Guild. Package your items nicely that you have to sell J
3. Tag each item individually and securely attach with a safety pin or what ever means you have to keep it on there good. Include your initials, item number, name/ description of item, and price.
Example DB #1 pumpkin wall hanging \$24.95
4. Each participant will bring list of their items.
(I will make a blank list for you to fill out which will include: your initials, the item number, name/description, and price. Space to check in items, check if sold or if unsold.)
5. Each participant will spend at least 3 hours working in the booth. This time is not credited to the time spent "working the show."
- 6 .Write receipts when working in the booth, Keep booth looking nice
7. Payment will be sent after the show is completed.

Dear WSQuilters,

A small group of us from WSQ are volunteering with Poulsbo resident Pat Verd at Mission Creek Women's Prison in their one and only quilting program. All quilts completed by inmates are donated to local charities. Without one of the volunteers at the facility from 1-3 p.m., no quilting happens. And believe me, the inmates express their thanks when we show up having waited for our arrival.

As you can imagine, many vital supplies for successful quilting are either not working well, in limited supply or completely missing.

Here's a list of stuff that we need to help us quilters succeed:

Sewing machines - All donated machines are serviced before entering into service.

Rotary cutters - medium size Olfa is preferred, 1 small rotary cutter would be nice.

Rotary blades

Ironing boards or pads

Irons

Quality fabric - especially tone on tone and solids

Pins

Pin cushions

Neutral thread

Sewing machine needles

Yarn

Plastic crochet hooks

Small plastic rulers

Knowing that a quilters mantra is: "If one is good, more is better", you might have some extras in your personal stash. If you are willing to share, please bring them to our next WSQ meeting or call me. I will gladly come to your residence to pick them up.
