

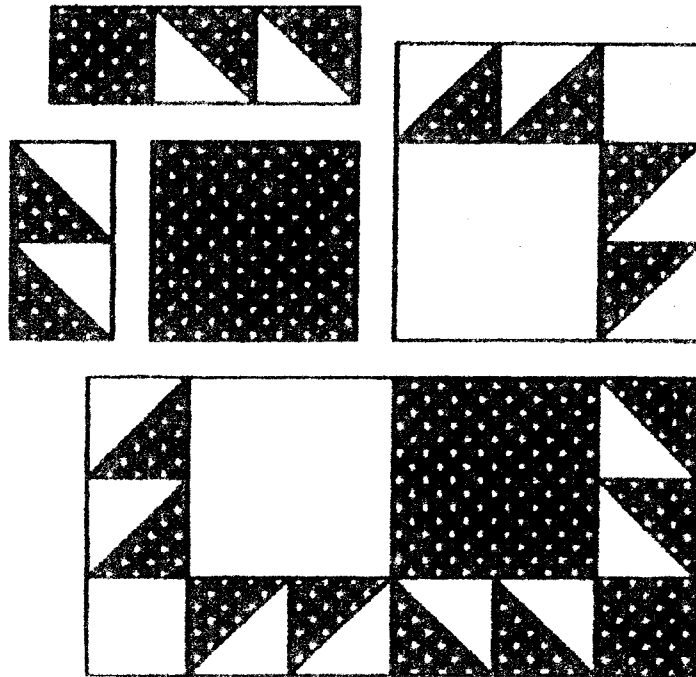
Block of the month for October- "Crow's Foot"

Select an off white tone on tone fabric for the background and two complimentary fabrics in fall colors.

From the background cut eight $2\frac{7}{8}$ " squares . cut in half to make triangles. Cut four $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares for corners.

From each of the fall colored fabrics cut four $2\frac{7}{8}$ " squares . Cut in half to make triangles. Cut two $4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

Sew colored triangles and background triangles together in pairs. Sew block together as shown.



This an alternative way to make quarter square triangles. Cut the fabric squares 5 1/2" square. For the Ohio Star be sure the lightest fabric is always on top. The darker part of the triangle should be on the right side when the triangles are made. For the Ohio Star sew on the right side of the drawn lines.

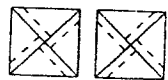
Directional Triangles

This method is used when the triangles are always in the same position, such as the dark triangle will always be to the left of the light triangle, or visa versa.

1. Layer two squares with right sides together and draw intersecting diagonal lines from corner to corner as shown.



2. Using a scant 1/4" seam, stitch as shown. Rotate block so that you can use the drawn line as a stitching guide. The instructions for each project will tell you whether to stitch on the left or right of the line.



3. Cut along drawn lines and press open.
