

## West Sound Quilters – Community Quilts

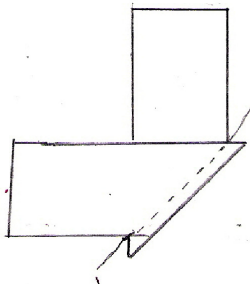
Our new pattern is “**Picket Fences**”, an adaptation of a pattern from “Quiltmaker” magazine, found (appropriately) by Nan Pickett.....

This is a one patch pattern: the basic unit is 3” wide, 5½” tall, with a 45 degree “corner” cut off. Each block is made from three pairs of this shape, with a light unit in the upper left and lower right corner of the block. A single block will measure 8” by 8”. A finished block in the quilt will measure 7 ½” by 7 ½”.

For a twin-sized quilt, our rows are 8 blocks wide and 10 rows long. Row one is arranged with the “stripes” set vertically; the second block has the “stripes” set horizontally. Continue across the row in this fashion. The second row will begin with the first block set horizontally and the second block set vertically. This should result in a light four-pointed star.

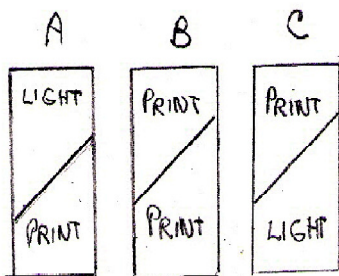
Our quilt has no border and will finish at about 60” by 75”.

**NOTE: *Since each quilt uses the same fabric for the light squares it is essential that all squares are completed and returned by the next guild meeting or the quilt will never be completed. The light fabrics are not interchangeable!!!!***



Be very careful of your ¼” seam

Line up your fabrics and put your needle in the upper intersecting corner to start sewing ¼” seam. End up the seam in the lower intersecting corner.



Sew Piece A to Piece B,  
then Piece B to Piece C using  
¼” seam.
